Safe Environment Training provides our teens with vital information about how to identify red flags in relationships and provides resources for support of those affected by abuse. It is a sensitive topic, but one that is so important to talk about so that we can stand together as a community against the evils of abuse.

Confirmation Sessions and Mass

What is Catechesis?

"Catechesis is an education in the faith of children, young people, and adults which includes especially the teaching of Christian doctrine imparted, generally speaking, in an organic and systematic way, with a view to initiating the hearers into the fullness of Christian life" -Catechism of the Catholic Church 5

Why have Confirmation Sessions?

These sessions are designed to allow teens to learn about the faith they are accepting as their own, in addition to growing in their personal relationship with God. Each session is geared toward a particular aspect of our faith and how to live faithfully. Teens are encouraged to engage with these sessions through participation in activities, prayer, and discussion. By discussing our faith and asking questions, we grow ever closer to the Lord. The goal here is not to study the faith like a subject, but rather to engage with our natural curiosity for the things beyond ourselves. By doing this, we can open ourselves up to the wonders God has for us.

When are the Sessions?

These sessions will take place twice per month (with some exceptions).

They will be from 3:30pm – 5:15pm. It is highly recommended that the 5:30pm Mass is attended as a family, especially on days of catechetical sessions. We ask that teens arrive no later than 3:30pm for these sessions. We begin right at 3:30pm, so please arrive on time.

Where are the Sessions?

Sessions will take place in Knight Hall, the large meeting room in our Pastoral Center. Teens will find and sit with their small group. Small groups will be the same as in Year 1. These groups will continue their journey together in faith.

<u>Mass</u>

Mass is at the very core of our faith. We believe that Mass is where heaven meets earth, where God enters into our messy world and offers us the gift of receiving Him into our hearts and our lives. With Mass and the Eucharist being the "source and summit" of our faith, we encourage each family to make a commitment to attend Mass every Sunday. We have arranged our Sunday sessions to be around the 5:30pm Mass to encourage everyone to come together for the heavenly banquet. Participating in Mass each week is a defining component of living the Catholic faith, and we want our teens to practice that in their lives leading up to their full initiation into the faith. We look forward to seeing you at Mass on Sundays!

Youth Ministry Events

What are Life Nights and Recharge?

An important part of our faith is that we gather and live in community. During the year we will have Life Nights where teens gather and grow in community through food, games, prayer, and fellowship. These nights are a great opportunity to find lasting friendships and a true home away from home here at the parish.

Recharge is, as the name implies, and opportunity to gather as a community and get recharged in the middle of our week. It grants an opportunity to re-center our lives on Christ in the midst of the craziness through fellowship and praying with Scripture!

Why Come to Youth Events?

In Matthew's Gospel, we see Jesus tell us that "where two or three are gathered in my name, there am I in the midst of them" -Matthew 18:20.

It can be hard for us to recognize this when we don't know those we are gathered with. Building a sense of community and of trust is vital to being able to truly learn what it means to be a member of the Church.

When and Where are Life Nights and Recharge?

Life Nights and Recharge will always begin in the Youth Room, located on the first floor of the Pastoral Center on the side bordering Calle la Primavera. Life Nights will be on Sunday evenings; 6:30pm - 8:00pm. Recharge will be on Wednesday evenings from 6:30pm-8pm. Occasionally, other Youth Night events will pop up on different days, and notifications about those dates will be sent to everyone via email/text.

Support Youth Ministry

Youth Ministry thrives when adults of the parish commit their time, talents and treasures to supporting the Youth. Our teens are not just the future of the Church, they are the Church NOW! We are in constant need of support through meals for our gatherings, volunteers willing to spend their time and share their hearts, and those willing to support us in the background. Additional Events

In addition to these weekly gatherings, we will also have other opportunities arise throughout the year. These include things like nights of worship and adoration, special events with other parishes, service opportunities, hikes, and more! Attendance Policy

What does the attendance policy look like?

We will have a total of 13 Confirmation sessions in year 2. In addition to these meetings, our Youth group meets every Sunday evening after Mass for Life Night, and on Wednesday evenings for Recharge. We ask that you commit to attending at least 7 Confirmation sessions, the Ceremony Rehearsal, and 3 Youth Group gatherings, whether they are Life Nights, Recharge, or other events that will pop up. The reason we ask for attendance at sessions and youth nights is not just to fill a room, but rather to ensure everyone on their Confirmation journey has the opportunities to engage in the community and find Christ at the center of it.

Why does the attendance policy look like this?

Teens are busy. There is no denying that simple fact. The last thing that we want is for being at church to feel like a burden or something that they are obligated to do. Church should be a place we are all excited to be at, and a place we feel and know we belong. Our hope is that by giving a bit more freedom of what teens are coming to, teens and their families can recognize the importance of being present in the community, and make the commitment to themselves and to God to grow in faith while still living their lives.

Ok, so how exactly does this work?

Attendance will be taken at every Confirmation session, Life Night and Recharge. Those numbers will be reviewed throughout the year, and if our team notices a teen that has not attended anything, or has very low attendance, we will reach out to meet and talk about the reason for the low attendance, and how we can help. Again, the goal of this journey toward Confirmation is a continued growth in our relationship with God. One of the main ways we do that is by coming to Mass and being involved with our community of faith. It shouldn't be a chore, but rather something that sustains us in this life. Our hope is that by having a plethora of opportunities at different times, teens can find a spiritual home here, know that they are loved and belong, and over time are excited to be here and come to Confirmation sessions to be with and pray with their small groups, find community and fun in Life Nights, and hear God's voice through Scripture at Recharge.

If anyone has questions, please feel free to reach out to the Youth Minister. He is happy to discuss your teen's journey and how we can best help you support them in faith!

Service Project

What is the Service Project?

The service project is a total of 10 hours spent in service to others. This can be anything from serving in a soup kitchen or food bank, helping with a charity event, or spending time with people in nursing or retirement homes. The list goes on, and upon completion of a project, you will write a one page reflection about the experience describing what you did, why you chose this act of service, and how it impacted you. These will be turned in once a year with the form showing what service you participated in with a signature from someone in charge of the service program.

Why do we do Service Projects?

We don't need to look very far in the Gospels to see that Jesus himself lived a life of ministry and service to others. He calls us to do the same in our lives as we try to imitate him. The Church teaches that we must always help those in need and always care for those who are pushed to the periphery by society. By engaging in these acts of service, our hope is to awaken and strengthen this sense of charity in each person.

When are Service Projects?

That is up to you! We recommend that you complete your hours and submit the required work before you get busy with finals. I recommend having it all turned in around February or March! You can submit these via the submission portal on the website or bring a printed out copy to turn in to your small group leader.

Note:

For those who serve in liturgical ministries such as altar serving or reading, this can count as <u>5 hours</u> of your service projects for the year, but not all. The reason for this is that while serving in a liturgical ministry is great and very important, we also want our teens to have experience in service to the local community outside of the Church.

We will send out a list of recommended places to volunteer, and throughout the year there may be opportunities available through Youth Ministry.

If you have a question about an organization that may count as service, please contact the Coordinator of Confirmation Preparation and Youth Ministry.

Weekend Retreat

Attendance at a Confirmation retreat is required by the bishop for the reception of Confirmation. If you cannot attend a St. Edward's retreat, you will need to attend the Confirmation retreat of another parish.

Dates:

The retreats will be held the weekends of

1. November 15th-17th, 2024

2. January 17th- 19th, 2025

Cost:

\$250 per teen. This payment helps us to cover the cost of room and board, supports our volunteers and musicians who are serving your teens this weekend, and pays for transportation to and from the retreat center.

Times:

Friday Drop Off – Please arrive at St. Edward the Confessor between 3:30pm and 4:00pm for check in. Buses will depart at 4:15pm SHARP.

Sunday Pick Up – We will depart from the retreat center at 11:30am on Sunday morning. This should put us at St. Edward the Confessor at around 12:30pm. The buses will be unloading in front of the Church. In order to unload the buses and send them off before traffic for the 1pm Mass starts, we ask that everyone help unload the buses and clear the area. Many hands makes light work!

To Register:

We will be sending out a link to the registration form for both retreats in September. Registration for the November retreat will close October 31st. Registration for the January retreat will close December 20th

Registration will require the submission of a Liability Release form and a signed behavioral contract.

Additionally, packing lists and reminders of drop off and pick up times will be sent as the dates get closer.

<u>Please make a note of the dates for retreat now!</u> If you know that you will be unable to make one retreat date, be sure to sign up for the other one before space runs out. If you cannot make either retreat date, please let me know sooner rather than later so we can find another retreat for your teen. <u>If we get to the end of the year and your teen has not attended a retreat, they will not be able to get Confirmed!</u>

Letter to the Bishop

Our bishop asks that all young people seeking the Sacrament of Confirmation write a letter to him talking about their journey toward the Sacrament and their desire for it.

Our bishops DO READ these letters! They love and care for each of you, and want to know about how your journey has been.

More information, including a detailed prompt, will be coming when I receive it from the diocese (Likely end of January). You will receive this information via email and at one of the sessions.

These letters will be due a month before our Confirmation Ceremony. They must be submitted via email to the Youth Minister.

The Confirmation Coordinator will be proof-reading these letters! Please double check your letters for any grammatical or spelling errors. Also, I encourage you to be open and honest in these letters. Each of us has a unique story and journey in faith, don't be afraid to share yours.
